

## **Immigration Enforcement Preparedness**

### **Actions for Members to Take NOW**

1. Develop a rapid response plan with family and trusted friends for what will happen if they are detained. This should include a family point of contact, what resources to draw upon, and who will take care of the kids, pets, etc.
2. Designate a family member to hold Power of Attorney.
3. Securely share A-Number with a trusted family contact.
4. Carry citizenship and/or immigration documentation (passport, green card, etc.) at all times, especially in areas of increased enforcement.
5. Update your Emergency Contact information with IUPAT District Council 4.
6. Join any trainings and information sessions provided.

### **How to Respond During an Enforcement Action**

1. Observe peacefully and document all encounters.
2. Inform the Rapid Response Coordinator of your location.
3. Avoid any blocking or obstructing of agents and vehicles.
4. Leave a location if there are physical confrontations involving other groups or individuals.
5. Don't resist, provoke, or obstruct federal officials. This includes not assisting workers to escape and not assisting workers in providing false or misleading information.
